MARYBETH ANTOINETTE (BLITZEN) has had a blessed and adventurous life in theatre thus far and is proud to be a part of the inaugural season of The 5 & Dime!! Her last role, Becca in Rabbit Hole, won her a Best Actress award at Theatre Jacksonville. She appeared in Nunsense as Sr. Robert-Anne. MaryBeth was awarded Best Actress in a Leading Role for her portrayal of Laura Keene in Theatre Jax's production of Our Leading Lady. Having recently relocated here from the west coast of FL where she was/is honored to be an active and award winning member of the theatre community in many plays,

musicals, cabaret shows, and concerts, MaryBeth's most memorable roles include Rose in *Gypsy* (Curtain Call Award – Best Actress Musical), Marjorie in *Extremities* and Lucy in *Jekyll & Hyde* (Awarded Sarasota Magazine's Best Actress in Drama and Best Actress - Musical for each role as well as Handy nominations for both). Other favorites were Magenta in the *Rocky Horror Show* (reprising in 2011 Venice Theatre), Daisy in *On A Clear Day*, Ramona in *Blue Plate Special* and Rizzo in *Grease*. MaryBeth finds herself comfortable in the role of a reindeer, especially one as bitter as Blitzen.



AMY NOEL J. CANNING (DANCER) is psyched about being a part of *The Eight*, working with such a talented cast, director and producers. Amy was most recently seen playing the 80 year old Esmerelda in Theatre Jax's production of *Wellfarewell*. Amy has been seen in plays in the past years at Theatre Jacksonville in such roles as: Kate in *Taming of the Shrew*, Helena in *Midsummer Night's Dream*, Lettice in *Lettice and Lovage*, Beatrice in *Much Ado About Nothing* and Lenny in *Crimes of the Heart*. She received the best Actress award twice and has since been nominated three times-a thrill every time! Before her

local community theatre stomp she played Kitty in *Six Degrees of Separation*, Off-Broadway at the Wings Theatre in NYC. She was in the award winning Off-Broadway production of *Leaf in the Mailbox* by Elan Zafir and performed stand up regularly in the big city. Most notably she was given the opportunity to open at Caroline's Comedy club on Broadway. She has performed many roles regionally as well as New York. She has performed in London, Ireland and Greece and credits much of her acting philosophy to her one time teacher, the great Zoe Caldwell. Amy has her MFA in acting and has taught theatre at University of Florida, and now teaches at FSCJ, adult acting classes for Theatre Jacksonville and is the Drama Teacher by day at Bishop Kenny High School. She has two amazing kids Carson and Henry and an understanding artist husband Jason. She thanks them all for an amazing ride.



STACI COBB (VIXEN) is a graduate of DASOTA (dance), and JU (Theatre/Dance/Voice). Post-graduation she spent 8 years working and studying in New York City, returning home to Jacksonville in 2003. Staci has sung back up for the late Phoebe Snow, played a lead in an Indian feature film (*Inscrutable Americans*), performed with Tony Award winner Donna McKechnie (TJ's *Happily Red 2006*), sung in an Amanda McBroom master class, and played lots of dream roles onstage. Staci has had the pleasure of playing Anne in *Bill W. and Dr. Bob*, Lucille Frank in *Parade* – winning a Players by the Sea Pelican

Award for Best Actress, Lesley in *Talking Heads* (PBTS), The Baker's Wife in *Into the Woods* (Theatre Jacksonville), Martha in *The Secret Garden* (TJ Supporting Actress Award), Sara Jane Moore in *Assassins* (also co-produced), Fastrada in *Pippin* (PBTS) and Meredith in *Bat Boy* (Pelican Award for Best Actress). Most recently, she had the pleasure of playing another notorious "vixen" - Roxie Hart (*Chicago*) at PBTS. Jacksonville directing credits include *Anatomy of Gray, Moon Over the Brewery* (TJ) and *The Who's TOMMY* (Players). She's also had the honor of performing as a featured soloist and actress with the Jacksonville Symphony Orchestra. Staci's thrilled to playing another amazing role alongside such a stellar cast! She's a co-founder and current President of The 5 & Dime, so it's especially awesome to be performing in her first 5 & Dime production. Love and gratitude to Michael and her fellow 'dimers! KENT LINDSEY (HOLLYWOOD) has had a tremendously exciting career. As an actor, Kent has appeared in the films Glory, Passenger 57, and Gl Jane, as well as numerous national and regional commercials, along with independent and industrial films. He won an acting award for his role as the HEAD in the 48 Hour Film Festival in 2007. Kent was best known for his original children's character, Safari Sam, host of the *Kids Club* on Fox. Safari Sam was recognized for his work with children by Attorney General Janet Reno, The City of Jacksonville, and more. Kent has been seen on stage in *The 1940*'s

Radio Hour, Side Man, Assassins, and Inherit the Wind. Kent is Vice President and part owner of Lindsey Films, a film and video production company. In 2010, Kent was President of the Meninak Club. Kent wishes to thank his wife and partner, Pepper, and their daughter, Samantha, for their support.



EDWARD MOURNINGWOOD (CUPID) is either a member of Jacksonville's burlesque subculture or a sexual deviant. Since November 2009, Ed has produced locally, with partners Belladonna Knightshade and Anita Nightcap, the international art salon concept, *Dr. Sketchy's Anti-Art School JAX*. After emceeing the burlesque art event for two years, Ed has since been heard to refer to himself as 'The Godfather of Jacksonville Burlesque', but only in actor bios. An accomplished Legilimens, Edward was never-the-less surprised to be asked to act as Cupid, the openly gay reindeer, considering he doesn't think of

himself as a reindeer or an actor. However, Ed found that his fellow thespians hardly batted a false eyelash at his own smug narcissistic egotism. Used to being surrounded by beautiful nearly-naked women while on stage, Mr. Mourningwood finds this production of Jeff Goode's *The Eight: Reindeer Monologues* to be a bit of a sausage fest. Ed wishes more people would give him money.



BILL RATLIFF (DONNER) has been a part of the Jacksonville theatre community for a quarter of a century. His most recent appearances have been in the Players by the Sea summer musicals *The Who's Tommy* (Uncle Ernie), *Parade* (Hugh Dorsey), *Sweeney Todd* (Judge Turpin) and *Bat Boy: The Musical* (Dr. Parker). Other PBTS productions include *Bill W. and Dr. Bob* (Bill W.), *Urinetown* (Cladwell), *The Lion in Winter* (Henry), *Mr. Roberts* (Mr. Roberts), *Equus* (Dysart), *The Dining Room* (multiple roles), *The Fantasticks* (El Gallo), *All My Sons* (Chris), and *A Walk in the Woods* (Honeyman).

Other local credits include Love Letters (ABET), I Hate Hamlet, Forever Plaid, Sylvia, Anything Goes, A Funny Thing Happened... (Theatre Jacksonville), Twelfth Night and MacBe*h (Shakespeare at the Met) and Side Man (Jacksonville Stage Company) as well as several appearances with the Jacksonville Symphony Orchestra. Bill is a graduate of Furman University where he studied theatre and earned his degree in Economics. Bill sends out thanks to his loving family; Beth, Sarah and Andy whose support means everything. Thanks also to Michael Lipp and all of the The 5 & Dime folks for allowing him to be a part of this incredible cast and production.



DAVE ALAN THOMAS (DASHER) is proud to be a part of this exciting and emerging theatre company and to be working with this top-notch cast. Dave received his MFA in theatre directing from Florida Atlantic University and received additional graduate training (Sanford Meisner technique) at Northern Illinois University, after earning a BA from UF. Last year, he studied in London at Shakespeare's Globe stage, where he performed the title role in *Macbeth*. Dave also serves as a sponsor of Middleburg High School's drama program. Local audiences may know him as either a director or an actor. He was last seen as

Capulet in *Romeo and Juliet* at Theatre Jacksonville. His most recent projects over the past year include directing award-winning productions of *Our Leading Lady, Parade*, and *The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee* at three separate theatres, along with his latest production, *Inherit the Wind*. He has also acted in a number of productions over the past couple of seasons, including such diverse roles as Jack in *The Importance of Being Earnest* and as Howie in *Rabbit Hole*. Michael has a Master's Degree in Molecular Biology from Vanderbilt University, and is a charter faculty member of Douglas Anderson School of the Arts, where he has taught Science and Musical Theatre and currently teaches Math.

MARY BETH WARD (Stage Manager) holds an A.S. in Entertainment Technology from FSCJ and works professionally as a freelance Stage Manager. She most recently managed Fahrenheit 451 with The 5 & Dime, Inherit The Wind at Theatre Jacksonville, and the regional tour of Fiddler on the Roof with AIM Management. 
