ZORA NEALE HURSTON



Before Oprah, before Rosa Parks, and before Maya Angelou, there was Zora Neale Hurston, Florida-born author, folklorist and anthropologist and a legendary figure in the Harlem Renaissance. Like so many writers, she was ahead of her time and not fully appreciated by her contemporaries. Now she is considered one of the most important African-American women of the Twentieth Century. Her novel, *Their Eyes Were Watching God* is considered an American Classic.

Hurston was a collector and relentless reporter of indigenous speech and in SPUNK, the black English of the urban and rural America of her time has been preserved. Listen and watch as stories of a master storyteller and life observer come alive..

In 1904, when she was 13, and two weeks after her mother's death, Zora Neale Hurston was sent to live in Jacksonville, where she joined her sister and brother who were attending school at Florida Baptist Academy.

THE CAST



CJ FLUHARTY (GUITAR MAN) 's extensive theater experience consists of Mandarin High School's production of *Once Upon a Mattress* in 1992. Seriously, that's it. David's creative journey continued as he collaborated with Al Letson (host of NPR's State of the Re:Union) and Larry Knight to form Griot3. The group's initial project was *Griot: He Who Speaks the Sweet Word*, a "choreopoem" that traces the art of story telling from the shores of West Africa to the birth of Hip Hop. *Griot* was then accepted into the International Fringe Festival in New York and received rave reviews. For his performance in *Griot*, he received Best Male Actor from Players By The Sea in Jacksonville, Florida.

David has added to his credits by opening for Nikki Giovanni with Griot3, performing at the Nuyorican Poets Café, The Baruch Performing Arts Center and Lincoln Center in New York City. From *The Exonerated, Julius X, Twilight: Los Angeles 1992, Crumbs, The Full Monty, Gem of the Ocean*, and his one-man show, *Starring Me*, he continues to grace the stage.

David is extremely happy to be part of a Zora Neal Hurston piece. He would like to extend his heartfelt thanks to Lee Hamby and the rest of the SPUNK cast and crew for allowing him to continue to follow his dream. 
