DIRECTOR'S NOTES

I am a story-teller from way back. Just ask my mom.

When I first started studying the craft of acting, I landed my first lead: Emily Webb in Our Town. (It's totally cliché, but Our Town remains one of my favorite stories to this day.) It's a beautiful snapshot of life – the good and the bad – simply told, but resonant in a myriad of ways...a lot like the piece you're about to see: Transparent, fully exposed and honest.

In August 2009, I was visiting New York and had the honor of seeing Naked Angels' Off Broadway production of Next Fall. I loved it on face value for its Our Town references and connections. But what I found in the telling was so powerful to me.

I didn't know much about the story and it had the potential to be a little judge-y considering the themes involved: gay couple, one's an atheist and one's a Christian in a relationship where the religious differences are palpable. I am a Christian who believes in the risen Christ and the "law" of love. But let's face it, there are "Christians" out there who haven't ever lived from a place of love. Judging others is not in the job description – loving is – and Geoffrey Nauffts does such a beautiful job conveying that through the wonderfully written Luke.

So to me, Next Fall is a beautiful snapshot of love (in its various forms) and the idea that we love people both in spite of AND because of who they are. What I found in Next Fall was a thought-provoking, honest, funny piece about two people falling in love and trying to navigate a typical couple issue. In most relationships such a completely divisive conflict would be a deal-breaker. But love wins.

Telling this story wouldn't have been the same without the contributions of this spectacular cast of sensitive artists, the devoted storytellers of The 5 & Dime, a terrific production team, and the love of a remarkable man. Being loved well in spite of and because of who I am is the greatest gift God could give me...so thank you, God for Brian Grant.

I'm excited to bring this show to Jacksonville in light of all of the dialogue recently being stirred up. But at its core, this play is about two people in love dealing with issues any couple might deal with - they just happen to be two men. I hope their love speaks loudly and that more conversations in our community are sparked as a result.

STACI COBB GRANT (Director) is a graduate of DASOTA (dance), and JU (Theatre/Dance/Voice). Post-graduation she spent 8 years working/studying in New York City, returning home to Jacksonville in 2003. Staci has sung back up for the late Phoebe Snow, played a lead in an Indian feature film (Inscrutable Americans), performed with Tony Award winner Donna McKechnie (TJ's Happily Red 2006), sung in an Amanda McBroom master class, and played lots of dream roles onstage.
