ACTOR'S NOTES

I remember the day I came back to America.

Walking into the bedroom I shared with my sister, I flipped the light switch.

The light came on.

I just stood there, with my hand against the wall thinking how easy it was - thinking how many thousands of times I had never noticed or appreciated how different, how easy our lives are here – and how I would try never to take that for granted again.

We had just returned from a year living overseas with my parents' families. I loved it there -I do still love it there.

While this play tells stories inspired by Heather Raffo's Iraqi roots and my family is Lebanese, we have quite a lot in common. There are obvious cultural commonalities. We eat the same foods; we speak a version of the same language. But more significantly for me, the women she shares with us remind me of the women in my family, and of myself.

For me, this is a play about generations of love, passion, joy, and survival - not war or politics. It is about the kind of women from which I was born. So, I am here to honor them as best I can.

Heather Raffo says about her work, "I consider all the women in my play to be dramatized characters in a poetic story. I liken it to song writing - I listened deeply to what each woman said, what she wanted to say but couldn't, and what she never knew how to say. Then I wrote her song."

ZEINA SALAME (actor), a co-founder of The 5 & Dime, has enjoyed the last several years teaching English and Theatre at Daytona State College. She has an MA in English from UNF and an MS in Theatre from FSU. Favorite Jacksonville roles include Josie in *A Moon for the Misbegotten* and Helen *in Fat Pig.* Looking forward to her next adventure at the University of Oregon, she will take on a graduate teaching fellowship and begin work on her PhD in theatre this Fall.

MICAH DAVIS (guitarist) is a singer, songwriter, and producer from Jacksonville, FL. Receiving guitar lessons from his classically trained father, Micah began playing music at an early age. His continued studies and tireless devotion to the art have bolstered him into a guitarist who exemplifies the styles of Classical, Jazz, Blues, R&B, Pop, and Rock. By the age of 18, Micah mastered his instrument and soon ventured into a new territory of singing and songwriting. Inevitably this became a new way for Micah to express himself. Completely self-taught in the subject matter, Micah quickly began putting ideas together, and within a few years he amassed a catalog of almost 100 songs. Along with fronting his own band, The Summit (thesummitband.com), he is also a producer and engineer for Mr. Mince Productions. Micah is a member of BMI and The Recording Academy.

 - 1920-21 Britain creates state of Iraq. Iraqi Revolution begins in rebellion against British rule. Faysal, son of Hussein Bin Ali, is crowned Iraq's first king.
 - 1932 Iraq becomes an independent state.
 - 1958 The monarchy is overthrown in a military coup led by Brig Abd-al-Karim Qasim and Col Abd-al-Salam Muhammad Arif.
 - 1963 Prime Minister Qasim is ousted in a coup led by the Arab Socialist Baath Party (ASBP). The Baathist government is then overthrown by Arif.
 - 1968 Baathist lead a coup. Revolution Command Council (RCC) takes charge with Gen Ahmad Hasan al-Bakr as president.
 - 1979 Saddam Hussein succeeds Al-Bakr as president.
 - 1980 -88 Iran-Iraq war.
 - 1990 Iraq invades Kuwait, prompting the US-led first Gulf War, which forces Iraq to withdraw.
 - 1992 A no-fly zone, is set up in southern Iraq.
 - 1995 Partial resumption of Iraq's oil exports to buy food and medicine (oil-for-food program).
 - 1998 Iraq ends cooperation with UN Commission to Oversee the Destruction of Iraq's Weapons of Mass Destruction. UN staff are evacuated from Baghdad, and the US and UK launch a bombing campaign, "Operation Desert Fox", to destroy Iraq's nuclear, chemical and biological weapons programs.

CARYL BUTTERLEY (creative team) lived in New York City for over twenty years, working as an actor, director, and cabaret artist. Highlights include directing a concert performance of the new musical, *Fallen Angel*, featuring legendary vocalist Phoebe Snow, at the Bay Street Theatre; producing and directing *Downtime*, a weekly cabaret series at Eighty-Eighty's; serving as artistic director of the symphonic recording of the musical *Eagle Song*; and a season at the renowned Manhattan Theatre Club as assistant production manager for the Off-Broadway productions of *Lips Together Teeth Apart*, *Sight Unseen*, and the Broadway production of *A Small Family Business*. Caryl studied acting at HB Studio with Oscarwinning actress Sandy Dennis, musical performance with Broadway legend Betty Buckley, and was a fellow with the Eugene O'Neill Theatre Center. Most recently she directed *Once On This Island*, *The Sugar Bean Sisters*, and *Heroes* at ABET, and *Fahrenheit 451* for The 5 & Dime, of which she is a founding member.

TIFFANY SULLIVAN FISH (creative team) began her professional dance career with the Genesis Dance Company and worked for the Genesis Foundation for the Arts doing outreach programs throughout Brooklyn, The Bronx, Manhattan and Connecticut. She then went on to perform with the Metropolitan Opera with such artists as Sean Curran, Doug Varone and Julie Taymor. After receiving her MFA in Choreography from Jacksonville University she has been collaborating and teaching with artists from the US, Israel, Austria, Iceland, France and South Africa. This international exposure has been paramount in informing her current ventures within dance creation and dance research. Tiffany often uses the medium of film to communicate her artistic vision and her films have been screened nationally and internationally. She recently won best experimental film at the 2012 Portland Film festival for a film she created in Skagastrond, Iceland with choreographer, Rebecca R. Levy. This past January Tiffany co-founded Jacksonville Dance Theatre with the vision to bring a sustainable professional dance culture to the first coast. She is excited to be collaborating with The 5 & Dime on this thought provoking and beautiful project.

SOMMER FARHAT (creative team) is an elementary school teacher at Mandarin Oaks Elementary School. When she is not teaching she loves to be on stage acting. She was last seen in Theatre Jacksonville's *The Triangle Factory Fire Project*. Her other credits include Theatre Jacksonville's *Is He Dead?*, *Night of January 16th*, *Dearly Beloved* and *The Beaux' Stratagem*. She was also in many improvisational murder mystery shows with Murder Mystery Inc. Sommer also teaches Drama to kids in grades k-5 during the summer for Duval County Public Schools.She is a proud Palestinian American and is a member of the Ramallah American Club of Jacksonville. This piece is very personal to her because it shows the true strength and struggles of Middle Eastern women. She is thrilled to be part of the creative team for this show and working with her amazing friends at The 5 & Dime.
