Bearing Witness

This exhibition is inspired by Al Letson's play *The Centre Cannot Hold*, an expression of his experience as a reporter and human being during the Rally Against Hate that took place in Berkeley, California in the summer of 2017. Just as in Charlottesville, Virginia, during what is often referred to as the 'summer of hate', protestors, counter-protestors and police were brought face to face in a moment of great tension. Letson found himself serving as a human shield protecting a man being beaten in the streets by five masked protestors. This moment and its aftermath were fraught with complexity, leaving Letson...and all of us...to reckon with issues on both a national and highly personal level.

Robin Kunkel's series We Keep Us Safe: Community Defense in Charlottesville captures the intimacy of human reactions to the events as they unfolded during the Unite the Right Rally. "We've all seen the overhead videos of that day; these images are not that. Rather than a play by play of events, these are the people who caused them, suffered them, and survived them. This is their fear, aggression, their sadness, and determination." Kunkel is an artist and community organizer from Kentucky who uses her camera to amplify the work of anti-racist and prison abolition activists. As she bears witness she does not attempt to "demonize or valorize, but to show the very real and current face of organized white supremacy and the equally real need for active opposition."

Equally as powerful and intimate are the works by Deja Echols. Based in Jacksonville, Echols is honing her voice as an activist within the African American community by focusing her work on themes of representation and identity. She is inspired by those before her, like Renaissance woman Augusta Savage, but is also driven by her desire to be seen in the hierarchy of art history. "Representation matters. Without representation, how can I spark hope in those who are underrepresented?" This commitment is especially poignant in this series "Black Voices in White Spaces" where the consistent threat of violence against young black men is intensly rendered in scenes of martyrdom. Echols works provide an important narrative in attempting to understand the lived experience of Al Letson and any black man in America.

For more than a year, the Gallery at The 5 & Dime has hosted exhibits curated by Yellow House. Each installation connects to the themes and ideas explored on stage and express the commitment of both organizations to exploring socially relevant issues through the power of art.
