DIRECTOR'S NOTES

BY WILL DAVIS, DIRECTOR

This story is an amazing opportunity to see into the mind of a writer at such a seminal time. Not just an important time for Jonathan Larson, but a common moment that all creators face. The time to decide, stay on the bull and fight it out, or accept the time for what it has been and come back from Neverland. This, on the surface of things, is the story of *tick*, *tick...BOOM!*

Stopping there, however, would be a disservice to the story, the work, and the importance of a life lived well. It's not really what the story is about. Sure, it's about the possibility of giving up on some things (raising kids, a nice house, a dishwasher) in order to attempt a dream. Those are things of which Jon has to weigh the importance. The decision of career vs things isn't that difficult for Jon though. That's why the answer to that question isn't very valuable.

He's asking the wrong question. Throughout the show he asks what should I do. The problem here is the word "what".

When a struggling artist needs to find answers, they work through it with what they know, their art. And so the battleground here is Jon's mind. He takes a conglomeration of his friends, his places, his worries, and dumps them all out into this script. The battleground of his mind becomes the battleground of the stage. We get to see Mr Larson put his life in front of us, take the pieces, turn them over in his hands, and try to make sense of it all. At time we see his friends as they are, at times we see them as he fears they may be. In the end, we see Jon find It isn't "what" that brings value to his life, it's "why".

Only answering that question can fulfill him and give him purpose. He has to fight to go beyond himself and find meaning in his life.
