

DIRECTORS' NOTES

Who gets to be the main character in a story?

For thousands of years, people have told stories - books, movies, plays - that center on a hero's journey. OK super - that's all well and great for the hero.

Who is destined to be a side character?

How do we know when the story is about us - or if we're just unimportant non-player characters in the great video game of the universe?

In the 2006 Nancy Meyers classic "The Holiday," screenwriter Arthur Abbot tells pond-crossing vacationer Iris Simpkins "In the movies, we have leading ladies and we have best friends. You, I can tell, are a leading lady. But you're behaving like the best friend." She answers, "You're right! You're supposed to be the leading lady of your own life, for God's sake."

But even if we all center ourselves in our stories - lean in to our "main character energy"- that still necessitates the creation of side characters. Someone HAS to play that part. If they weren't essential to plot progression, we wouldn't constantly coddle performers with the "there are no small parts, only small actors" platitude.

In Tom Stoppard's "Rosencrantz and Guildenstern are Dead", he examines the inner life of Hamlet's two smallest side characters who get sent on a journey early in the story only to be briefly announced as dead later in the play. In his version, they meet The Player, who tells them "We do on stage things that are supposed to happen off. Which is a kind of integrity, if you look on every exit as being an entrance somewhere else."

Maybe there is valor in de-centering yourself from time to time. Maybe, the secret is honoring the main character in others. To use the power of our words to uplift people to believe in themselves. Perhaps that is what truly makes a hero. A very wise old man with twinkling eyes once said "Words are, in my not-so-humble opinion, our most inexhaustible source of magic. Capable of both inflicting injury, and remedying it."

Something to think about.

Oh, also from Stoppard's play? "The colours red, blue and green are real. The colour yellow is a mystical experience shared by everybody." Let's embrace the yellow tonight.
